ANNOUNCEMENT

Through cooperation of the Institute of Management Sciences (TIMS), the Operations Research Society of Spain, the Operational Research Society of India, and the Operations Research Society of Japan, four coordinated meetings that extend around the world will be held in 1967. Each of these sponsors will be responsible for the arrangements of its meeting, where the Mexico meeting is the 14th International Meeting of TIMS. However, there will be overall coordination among the meetings, and the Meeting Coordinator should be contacted concerning participation in some or all of these meetings. The programs and travel arrangements will, to a large extent, be under the direction of the Coordinator. One exception is that persons residing in Spain, India, or Japan, and attending only the meeting in their residence country, should deal directly with the society sponsoring the meeting in that country. Another exception is that persons planning to attend only the Mexico meeting should deal directly with TIMS concerning participation on the program.

All papers will be of an invited nature and of two lengths (long or short). Potential participants are requested to send abstracts to the Coordinator for consideration. Authors of suitable papers will be invited to make presentations at meetings they are able to attend. February of 1967 is the (extended) deadline for submitting papers. Also, persons who are able to attend and are available to organize and/or chair sessions, to be discussants, panel members etc. should contact the Coordinator. As currently envisaged, every attendee will provide his own travel support. However, reduced airline fares (from group travel) may be obtainable if sufficient numbers of persons are willing to travel together. Membership in TIMS or an operations research society is not necessary for attending or participating in the meetings. However, such membership may be needed for participating in group airline travel.

EMPHASIS OF STATISTICS

The many aspects of using statistics in operations research will receive strong emphasis for these meetings. Here, both reports on applications of statistics and the development of techniques are of interest. The timing of the meetings in Spain, India, and Japan coordinates with the 6th International Biometric Conference and the 36th Session of the International Statistical Institute (held consecutively in Australia). That is, the Japan meeting (now extended to include August 18) ends on Friday and the Biometric Conference starts the following Sunday. For example, persons in Europe who are to attend the statistics meetings could participate in the operations research meetings by starting in Spain, starting in India, or by attending only the Japan meeting before going to Australia.

SECOND ANNOUNCEMENT

Four coordinated meetings that are concerned with operations research and extend around the world are being held in 1967. These meetings are devoted primarily to scientific considerations but will also emphasize personal contacts among operations researchers of different nationalities. Collectively, these meetings should constitute by far the most substantial operations research conference ever held, both in program and attendance. These meetings are, respectively, sponsored by the Operations Research Society of Spain, the Operational Research Society of India, the Operations Research Society of Japan, and The Institute of Management Sciences (TIMS).

Tentatively, the schedule of the meetings is: (1) July 28 through August 2, Bilbao, Spain. (2) August 7 through August 10, Delhi, India (cosponsored by the University of Delhi). (3) August 14 through August 18 (now extended to also include August 18), Tokyo and Kyoto, Japan. (4) August 22 through August 25, Mexico City, Mexico (the 14th International Meeting of TIMS).

Each meeting is the separate responsibility of its sponsor. There is, however, coordination among the meetings, which occurs through the Meeting Coordinator. The programs and travel arrangements are, to a great extent, under the direction of the Coordinator. He should be contacted about participation in one or more of these meetings. One exception is that persons residing in Spain, India, or Japan, and attending only the meeting in their residence country, should deal directly with the society sponsoring the meeting in that country. Another exception is that persons attending only the Mexico meeting should deal directly with TIMS concerning participation.

All papers will be of an invited nature and two lengths will occur (long and short). Potential attendees are requested to send abstracts of papers to the Coordinator for consideration. Authors of suitable papers will be invited to present their papers at meetings that they are able to attend. Also, persons who are able to attend and are available to organize and/or chair sessions, to be discussants, panel members, etc. should contact the Coordinator. February of 1967 is the deadline for submitting papers.

As presently envisaged, every attendee is expected to provide his own travel support. However, reduced airline fares (from group travel) may be obtainable if sufficient numbers of persons are willing to travel together,
